PRICE RISE IN CHURCH FIRE INSURANCE

The church fire insurance policy has more than tripled from last year's cost. In the new year there will be an appeal for donations to cover this unexpected expense.

HOLY WATER BLESSED AT THEOPHANY

Holy Water is that water which is blessed on the Feast of Theophany, the celebration of Christ's baptism in the Jordan, blessing the waters (and all of creation) by his presence therein. On Theophany, the faithful bring Holy Water containers to fill and bring home.

It is sprinkled and consumed "for the purification of the souls and bodies of all those who, with faith, shall draw and partake of it," "that Satan may speedily be crushed under our feet, and that every evil counsel directed against us may be brought to naught," and to "illumine us with the light of understanding and of piety, and with the descent of the Holy Spirit." (from the service of the Blessing of the Waters on the Feast of Theophany)

Holy Water is kept in the church so that the faithful may make use of it, for healing and strength in the case of illness or dealing with struggles in life, especially of a spiritual nature. Whether at home or at church, Holy Water should always be consumed with prayer. The Holy Water in the Narthex is available to replenish your container if you should run out at home.

Saint Luke of Crimea advised, "Drink holy water as often as possible. It is the best and the most effective medicine. I'm saying that not just as a priest but also from my experience as a doctor."

PLEASE EXIT QUIETLY

The Church is a house of prayer and it is important to remember that after the Divine Liturgy there are post communion prayers being read. All are welcome and encouraged to stay and pray. Both when you come up to kiss the cross and afterwards until exiting, please remain silent.
