#### GOOD WORKS FOR ADVENT

*Valley Churches United Canned Food Drive:* Bring cans of food and leave in the VCM barrel on the north side of the parish hall.

*Alms*: Almsgiving is above and beyond our tithe and is an important part of Orthodox piety.

**Food For Hungry People**: This is especially good for children because they see how to practice almsgiving, in this case for hungry people at home and around the world. This is our archdiocese sponsored charity. FFHP boxes are in the narthex, so take one home today. When the fast is over, return the loaded box to the Narthex for collection.

#### Coming to Communion

We all know that receiving the body and blood of Christ in the Holy Eucharist is a holy sacrament that should be done with reverence and humility. But what does that look like?

In addition to preparing ourselves with prayer, fasting, and a recent confession, there are a few ways we, who are unworthy, should approach the chalice.

+We stand in the presence of Christ. While the clergy are receiving, while we wait for our turn, and while others are receiving after us, it is proper to stand in reverence while the hymns are sung.

+We do not need to cross ourselves before or after receiving the Holy Eucharist. Receiving the body and blood of Christ is the greatest blessing we can receive. When we cross ourselves, we ask God's blessing on ourselves. It is unnecessary to bless ourselves before or after receiving the greatest blessing of the Holy Eucharist. There is also a danger of hitting the chalice with our hand and spilling the holy gifts. Simply come forward with your arms crossed over your chest.

+When you approach the chalice, it is a good practice to say your baptismal name, even if the priest knows it. Sometimes the multitude of names is overwhelming for the clergy.

+If you are not prepared to receive Communion, please approach the chalice as usual and say "Father Bless."

+After the dismissal, post-communion Prayers of Thanksgiving are read. All are welcome and encouraged to stay for these prayers. If you are not staying to pray, please take conversation outside so as not to disturb those who are praying.
