TIMES FOR CONFESSION

Confessions are heard after Vespers on Wednesday evenings (by appointment), on Saturday evenings following Great Vespers and by appointment during the week. If you desire to go to confession during Orthros, come prior to 9:15 am and send a message to one of the priests through one of the deacons.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Church teaches us through all of our senses. One way we learn is through the message of the hymns that are sung each week. Look at the Sunday variables and you will see the word Troparion. What does that mean? A Troparion is a hymn set to a special tone (melody) and is about a specific occasion or person. If the Troparion is for the Resurrection, then the event and sequence is made clear for us. If it is about a saint, then we learn about the saint's great faith and sanctity of his or her life. We sing a very famous Troparion during the Pascha service and continue to sing it 40 days later: Christ is risen from the dead trampling down death by death and upon those in the tombs bestowing life.

PARENTAL SUPERVISION

Parents remember to keep an eye on your children whenever they are on the church grounds, especially during coffee hour and other times of fellowship. No children should be without adult supervision on the back property or at the rectory.

Please have your children come up with you or an older sibling for the Eucharist when there is no Church School. Our younger parishioners benefit when they have a good example of how to approach the chalice.

Incense & Christian Worship

"Incense we offer unto thee, O Christ our God, as an aroma of spiritual sweetness which do thou receive upon thy most heavenly altar and send down upon us in return the grace of thine all-holy Spirit." (Priestly blessing of the incense)

The first and most basic pattern of worship we see in the Bible comes from Exodus 30: the offering of incense with prayers at the trimming of the lamps in the morning, and the lighting of the lamps in the evening. Still today we have this practice of prayer and the offering of incense at Orthros and Vespers. The offering of incense is not for us, to make the church smell good for us. The offering is to God. This is a sacrificial offering, an act of worship. We can offer incense to God at home, but the practice is most complete when we gather together as the Church, in the church.

"Let my prayer be set forth before Thee as incense, and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice." (Ps. 140)
