LOOKING AHEAD TOWARDS LENT

Last weekend the Zacchaeus Sunday Gospel concluded with the little Publican confessing to Jesus and his other guests that he had gotten rich from cheating people on their taxes. His next words showed that he understood what had to come next if his confession was to be genuine: restitution to those he wronged, charity for the poor.

This is an opportunity to re-examine the truly Orthodox view of confession, not as self-punishment or self-disrespect, but rather as a golden and joyful opportunity. The following quote sums it up quite nicely.

"To repent is not to look downwards at my own shortcomings, but upwards at God's love. It is not to look backwards with self-reproach, but forward with trustfulness. It is to see not what I have failed to be, but what, by the grace of Christ, I might yet become." (St. John Chrysostom)

Ask yourself if St. John doesn't have something good for you in that quote! It is the rare Christian indeed who isn't tempted to look down on her/himself, or backward at all the mistakes and missed opportunities of life. May we be encouraged this Lent to instead look forward to a confession that leads to what we still might become in Christ!

WHY CANDLES FOR THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST?

In about 450 AD in Jerusalem, people began the custom of holding lighted candles during the Divine Liturgy of this feast day. As St. Simeon received Christ in his arms, he exclaimed, "A light to enlighten the Gentiles and the glory of Thy people Israel." So we bring candles to the church to be blessed and give thanks for Christ the true light whom we have received. For Christians, these blessed candles serve as a symbol of Jesus Christ, who referred to Himself as the Light of the World. In some Western traditions you may even hear the feast called Candlemas.

"Let us become like Christ, since Christ became like us." St. Gregory of Nazianzus
